Course Content Suggestion From Kitty and Carole

Kemnay 2018 - Core Skills

To learn or revise traditional lace techniques to create a bookmark. The techniques covered will be Torchon, Buck Point and Bedfordshire.

During the course we will cover starting and finishing along with the core, essential elements of each type of lace.

If you would like to incorporate colour into the pattern, we will be able to help. For colour inspiration, photos or pictures can be used.

We will provide patterns that can be lengthened or shortened. The idea would be that the lacemaker would prick out a length of pattern that would allow them to complete the piece during the course. So often, patterns are started at a course and the ending has to be done at home, afterwards.

As so many people have Kindles and e-readers, they have less use for a bookmark. It would be good if everyone could come up with a suggestion of how to use a bookmark in a new and innovative way. We could have a prize for the best idea!

At a course elsewhere earlier this year, we spent the first hour talking about colour coded diagrams. Some people had never used them, and others had used them but we not confident. We spent a bit of time introducing the principles and by the end of the hour everyone had learnt something, even those who had used the diagrams before. Understanding the colour coded diagrams opens up a whole world of patterns. If you would like, we can incorporate this into the course.

As with every year, if people want to do their own pattern, that will be ok. If we can know what people are doing in advance, it would help us prepare.
